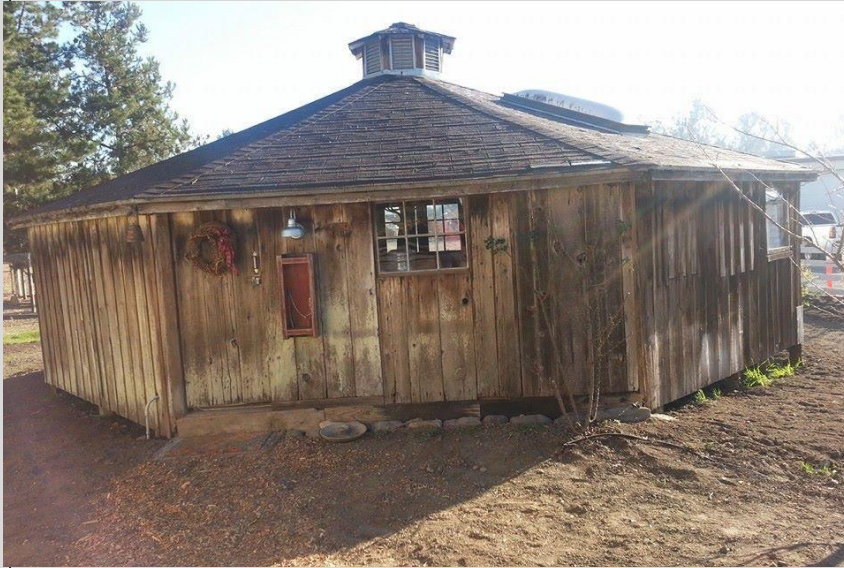

- Provide training and job opportunities to young graziers to serve local communities

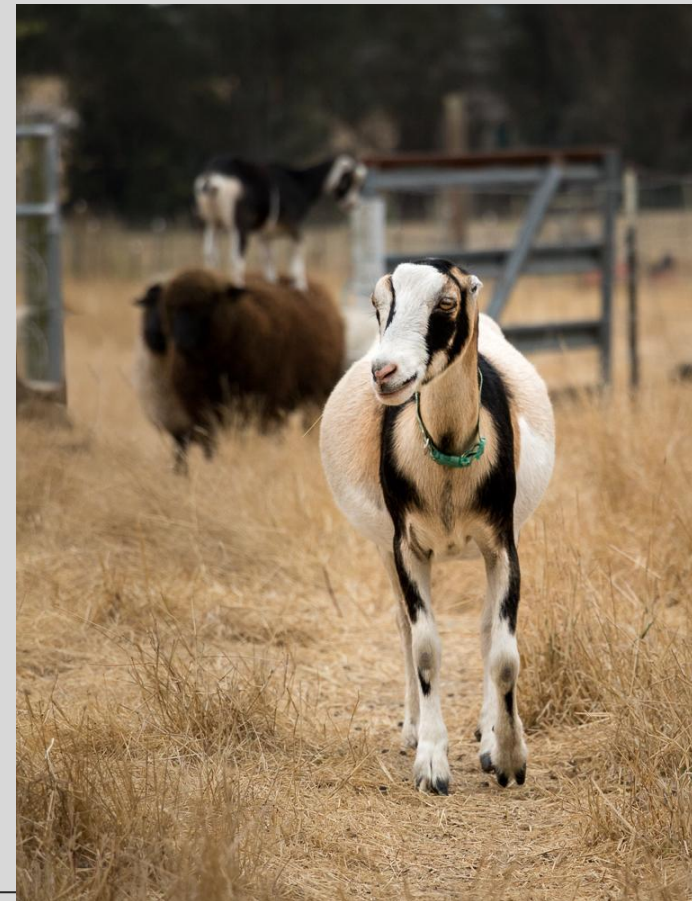
Communities Working Together



COMMUNITY GRAZING COOPERATIVES



It is quite profound to witness the increase in awareness simply from the greater connection with the grazing animals and their positive impact. These changes may seem inadvertent or unplanned, but they are the natural and concurrent evolution that takes place with a grazing cooperative.



How it works

Our Community Grazing Cooperative is a method for rural residential neighborhoods to empower themselves in their own land stewardship. The grazing ruminants are shared by the community, walked down the road from neighbor to neighbor to serve as community ambassadors, to manage everyone's fire fuel load and to improve the aesthetics of the neighborhood.
